Confucian Classics - Traditional Chinese Characters

The Confucian Classics had a position among Chinese literature like the bible has in the West. Scholars attempting to graduate in the state examinations had to learn, to explain and to exegete the most important of these books. For the Confucian society, these classical writings contained the basic knowledge for the state system as well as for the conduct at home.

Chinese classic texts or Chinese canonical texts (Chinese: 经; pinyin: diǎnjī) refer to the pre-Qin Chinese texts, especially the Confucian Four Books and Five Classics (四书五经). All of these pre-Qin text were written in classical Chinese. They can be referred to as jing (经).

Through this moral self-cultivation, one's li (principle) and qi (psychophysical stuff) are in harmony, leading to consistent moral behavior. Zhu Xi prescribed that The Great Learning be the first of the Confucian Classics read, as the message contained in The Great Learning would orient scholars to think about the value of their studies.
