#### Introduction (5 minutes)

- Tell your students that today they will be learning about the digestive system.
- Explain that the digestive system consists of various parts that enable food to enter your stomach, be absorbed and distributed, and be released from your body in the form of waste.

#### Explicit Instruction/Teacher Modeling (40 minutes)

- Go over the Digestive System worksheet with your students.
- Explain each part using the blurb on the side of the worksheet and come up with some examples to help clarify.
- An example for the esophagus: Explain to your students that the esophagus carries food from the throat to the stomach. Tell your students that chewing something large makes you cough because it gets stuck in your esophagus. Explain to your students that problems with the esophagus can lead to heartburn.

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
